## Camera Set Up

Outdoor Sport Day
F/16 or F/8
250-500 Shutter
Speed
ISO 100-400

Weather and lighting conditions will be the biggest problems.


70-300 mm lens

## Where To Stand

Get as close as you can. Stand or sit behind the back line or even sit next to the net (if the judge will let you)
You may have to shoot practices, since meets are harder to shoot.


## Length Of The Game

Tennis is not a timed game. Players play a set - several matches. Scoring is very unique to this sport.
Most players will take between 30 min to 1 hour to complete a match.
Tennis is played by singles or doubles.


## Safety

Tennis is fairly safe, but tennis balls do move very fast and can hurt if you are hit by one.
Watch out if you shoot near the net.


## Gotta Get 'Em Shots

Tennis can be a very fast sport.
There are few time outs, so you must shoot constantly.


## Backup Plan - aka Plan "B"

Always get shots of players on their forehand and backhand. Look for players serving and playing both close and far from the net.
Look for emotion and physical
 exertion.
